Applying a Can Do Lens to Multilingual Development (9:00 am - 12:30 pm MST)

This interactive institute from WIDA will explore ways to use WIDA's Standards Frameworks for Spanish, WIDA's Performance Definitions, and other related tools that can be used for determining students' linguistic strengths and planning language instruction and assessment in the bilingual classroom. Facilitators: Yvonne Williams, WCEPS Director of MLL Educator Engagement, and Tim Boals, WIDA Senior Research Scientist.

CAL SIOP for Dual Language Programs: Developing Language and Content in Two Languages

This interactive institute from the Center for Applied Linguistics (CAL) is designed to provide participants with an overview on using SIOP methods in DL instruction. K-12 DL teachers and coaches will learn about the eight components of the SIOP Model while addressing the three pillars of DL programs: bilingualism and biliteracy, high academic achievement, and sociocultural competence. The Institute will include a variety of activities, including demonstrations, simulations, explanations and small-group tasks and will encourage reflection needed for each teacher to adapt the CAL SIOP methods to their own unique circumstances. No prior knowledge of the SIOP Model is required for participation. School teams are encouraged to attend together. Facilitators: Lisa Tabaku—Center for Applied Linguistics, and Joel Gómez—Center for Applied Linguistics.

DLE Secondary Institute: Essentials for Planning and Implementation

This institute explores the essential components of a secondary (7th – 12th grade) dual language education program model, including the instructional expectation and accountability of the dual language secondary classroom. The institute will be facilitated by veteran dual language teachers, educational leaders, researchers, and students who will speak to their experiences in implementing and sustaining a successful DLE program. Together we will explore the challenges and potential responses, as well as celebrate the promising practice we have identified TOGETHER. Español Académico en CILAC Freire: Enseñando y Aprendiendo

En este Instituto, compartiremos nuestra experiencia como facilitadores del la enseñanza del español en el Centro Internacional de Lenguas, Arte y Cultura Paulo Freire, desde la perspectiva Freiriana que existe entre la Lengua, Cultura y la Realidad. Implementing a Translanguaging Space

This interactive preconference will provide examples of multiple dual language classrooms implementing a translanguaging space. Participants will explore how to design and plan for a classroom space for instruction and assessment, and strategies to be used with bilingual students. This workshop will address topics including: translanguaging core beliefs, multilingual ecology, translanguaging unit plans, and translanguaging strategies. Facilitators: Dr. Susana lbarra-Johnson—New Mexico State University, Natalie Olague—Dual Language Education of New Mexico.

Making Math Accessible During Online and Blended Instruction

Join us to address the challenges we are facing across our country with math instruction in our virtual and hybrid realities. This pre-conference institute will include an online classroom demonstration with concrete ideas for delivering virtual instruction making it accessible and engaging for all students, especially our language learners and dual-language students. Learn new ideas on how to maximize your current materials to provide low-floor high-ceiling tasks that allow all students an entry point as well as a space for productive struggle. The institute targets kindergarten through secondary district and school-based mathematics teachers and leaders. An overview of DLeNM's powerful mathematics framework, Achievement Inspired Mathematics for Scaffolding Student Success (AIM4S3™) will be included. Facilitators: Lisa Meyer, Erin Mayer, and Evelyn Chávez—Dual Language Education of New Mexico.

Optimizing Instruction for Multilingual Learners with Special Educational Needs

In this institute we will examine key components of effective instruction for multilingual learners with special educational needs, including: peer interaction, oral communication, comprehension, and bilingualism. During the day we will practice instruction and intervention approaches for both young and adolescent students, survey classroom-based research that optimizes learning, and review multilingual resources and supporting research pertaining to the benefits of bilingualism for learners with special educational needs. Facilitators: Cristina Sánchez-López—Paridad Education, and Theresa Young—Sound Communication

Overview of Project GLAD®

Come learn about Project GLAD®, a model of teacher professional development from the Orange County Department of Education's National Training Center. This model is dedicated to building academic content knowledge and literacy for all students, especially language learners, in a classroom environment that promotes collaboration, risk taking, equity of voice, and accountability. During this one-day institute, participants will experience an overview of the big ideas behind GLAD® instructional routines and strategies and participate in modeled virtual GLAD® instruction. Participants will also consider various approaches to effectively bring GLAD® training to their schools and districts to elevate teaching and learning for all students. Facilitators: Diana Pinkston, and Kathleen Salgado—Dual Language Education of New Mexico.

Teaching Science and Engineering in the Dual Language Classroom

This five-hour workshop is designed for K-5 Spanish dual language (DL) teachers who teach or may be interested in including science and engineering concepts in their classes. First, we will explore science and engineering in the context of bilingual instruction. Next, we will discuss strategies for incorporating science and engineering problem-solving and inquiry-based activities in dual language classrooms. The workshop will culminate in a collaborative hands-on activity that connects bilingual instruction in science and engineering to the Next Generation Science Standard (NGSS) and the Common Core Standards (CCS). Facilitators: Dr. Marialuisa Di Stefano—University of Massachusetts, Dr. Idalias Villanueva—University of Florida, and Dr. Alberto Esquinca—San Diego State University.

From Degradation to Empowerment: Lessons Learned in Indian Education

Joseph H. Suina is a Professor Emeritus in the College of Education at the University of New Mexico with 25 years of service. He directed the Institute for American Indian Education at UNM for tribes throughout the Southwest. Dr. Suina's publications on culture, education, and Native American issues are numerous. As a current member on several boards and committees, he provides voice for Native people in the areas of health, museums, language retention, sacred sites, economic development, and housing. Dr. Suina is an adjunct professor for Colgate University in New York and teaches courses in Native American Studies and education. Dr. Suina has maintained strong ties to Cochiti Pueblo throughout his academic career; he is a former



governor and a current tribal-council member. As an elder for the tribe, he provides guidance in the ways of tradition and culture for his people.


